

### BILLS OF LADING – WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Bills of Lading have been used for the transportation of goods for centuries. In the absence of some other formal transportation agreement, the Bill of Lading, is the "Contract of Carriage" and governs the legal relationship between the shipper and the carrier. Yet few people that use them rarely even look at them or really understand how important they are. Every mode of transport has its own different versions of bills of lading – truck, ocean, air and intermodal. Three leading attorneys will give you a "tour" of typical bills of lading for each mode and explain how the "contract of carriage", together with the applicable laws, treaties and tariffs, govern carrier liability and some of the "traps and pitfalls" for the unwary user. Freight Charges - What You Need to Know

Whether you are a seller or a buyer, the "delivered" price of products always includes the cost of transportation - freight charges - and it can make a big difference. Many large shippers negotiate formal transportation contracts, but others just get a rate – over the phone or in an email – from a carrier or broker. However, even sophisticated purchasers of transportation services often don't understand the basics of carrier pricing. ### INTERNATIONAL TRADE - SOURCING, SELLING AND SHIPPING IN 2024

For years we have been seeing "Made in China" labels on all sorts of goods, but things are changing. Political, environmental, social and labor conditions, quotas, tariffs and duties, as well as rising costs for shipping are causing importers to look elsewhere. And American manufacturers and producers would like to sell "Made in the U.S.A." products and intellectual property in foreign markets, but often run into complicated restrictions. 
